If you are new to the area or are attending Mass here, please visit the parish office and register or download a registration form at the above website, and mail to the office. Young adults, 18 years or older of families already registered, are invited to register under their own name. Your membership and presence at Mass will be a blessing to us.

### Parish Stewardship

Santa Maria De La Paz is totally dependent on the generosity of its parishioners for support. Your time, talent and treasure are essential to the continuation of our parish activities and services. Regardless of your level of participation, we need your help in practicing stewardship for the building of the Kingdom of God on a regular basis.

### Sacrament of Baptism

Expectant parents must be registered members of this parish for at least 6 months and should call the Parish Office three months (3) **before** your baby's birth to make arrangements. Godparents should be at least 16 years old, confirmed, and actively worshipping and sharing of their *time, talent, and treasure* in the parish. If the godparents are married, they must be married according to the norms of the Roman Catholic Church.

### Sacrament of Confirmation (High School age)

For those considering the Confirmation Formation Process, the candidate must: 1) be a high school aged youth. 2) Have at least one year of religious education prior to confirmation class or **be concurrently enrolled in high school religious education** (or attend St. Michael's High), and 3) Be willing to commit and have the faith readiness to embrace the Roman Catholic Faith Lifestyle. Candidates from other parishes are welcome to join our classes, with written permission from their parish

### Sacrament of Holy Matrimony

Contact the Parish Office to make arrangements at least six (6) months before planned date. Either the bride of the groom should be registered parishioners for at least one (1) year prior to wedding date. Each couple must be interviewed and begin their marriage preparation before any date can be officially set.

### Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick

Family members of anyone who is seriously ill or preparing for surgery are asked to call the parish office so that a time can be scheduled for Anointing. Please **do not** wait until the sick person is near death or has passed away.

### Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA)

RCIA is for those **adults** who are inquiring about the Roman Catholic Faith or are needing to complete their Sacraments of Initiation (First Eucharist and Confirmation).

### Rite of Christian Initiation of Children (RCIC)

This is a part of the RICA process and prepares **uncatechized children** for the Sacraments of Initiation (Confirmation and/or Holy Eucharist).

### Sacraments of First Reconciliation

#### & First Holy Eucharist

They are usually received within the 3<sup>rd</sup> grade and with at least one prior year of Religious Education.

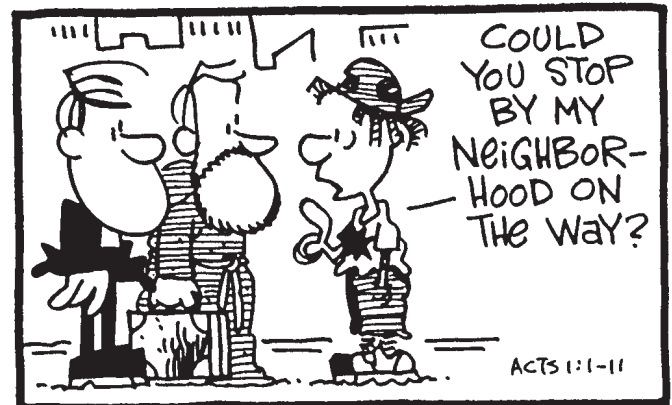
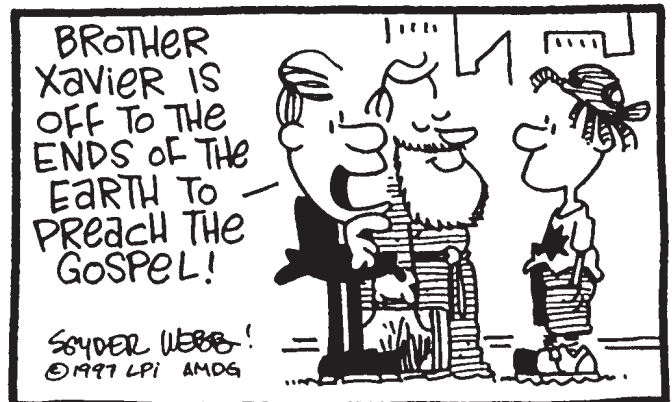

**Ascension of the Lord**

American Revivalism was one of the great religious movements that swept the country in waves after the Civil War. Its attention to personal spirituality and regular prayer is to be lauded. Many thousands were energized to accept the message of Christ through vibrant preaching and public altar calls. Like any great religious movement, the core was solid, but on its fringes one could see the fallacies that developed from exaggerated expectations.

One of the strangest developments came from the literal reading of today's Gospel. In this later addition to the end of Mark, Jesus is quoted as describing the signs that will accompany believers: "They will pick up serpents with their hands, and if they drink any deadly thing, it will not harm them." In their enthusiasm to show the strength of their faith, some preachers actually attempted these things, often with fatal results.

As we celebrate the Ascension of the Lord this day, we can see the signs that Jesus talks about actually happening. It's just that they occur in very ordinary, everyday ways. Consider the hospitals and medical services that Christians have provided through the centuries. In them, so many of the sick recover. Think of the comfort offered by groups like Catholic Charities that provide counseling services to so many. Through them, the demons of despair and depression are cast out. Through schools and universities, Christians have educated the young and provided opportunities for higher learning. Yes, in them people learned to speak new languages.

We don't need dramatic signs to attest to the strength of our faith. The words of Mark's Gospel are being accomplished every day in every corner of the world. "They went forth and preached everywhere, while the Lord worked with them and confirmed the word through accompanying signs." The Lord is indeed at work in the all that Christians are doing to heal, and teach, and care for those in need.
